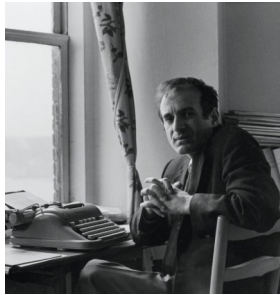

NEVER ALONE Sunday, March 16, 4:00 pm

Set against the backdrop of World War II and based on actual events, the film centers on Finnish businessman and philanthropist, Abraham Stiller, a key figure in the Jewish community, who risks everything to protect Jewish refugees fleeing Nazi persecution in Germany and Austria. As the Gestapo's influence grows and deportations to Auschwitz loom, Stiller fights to save those seeking sanctuary in Finland, a country caught in an uneasy alliance with Nazi Germany.

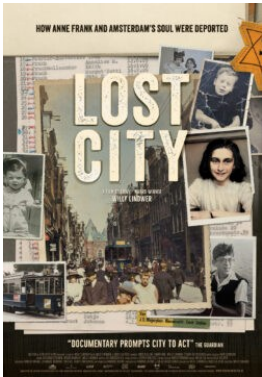

ELIE WIESEL: SOUL ON FIRE Sunday, March 23, 4:00 pm

With unique access to Elie Wiesel's family and personal archives, *Elie Wiesel: Soul on Fire* will seek to understand the known and unknown Elie Wiesel – his passions, his conflicts and his legacy. *Elie Wiesel: Soul on Fire* will ask: What drove Elie Wiesel throughout his life to be such a powerful voice for human rights? What were the dilemmas he struggled with? How can the lessons he drew from the Holocaust be applied to today's hostile world, where authoritarian leaders threaten to destroy fragile societies and where memory of the Holocaust has faded?

LOST CITY Sunday, April 6, 4:00 pm

“Lost City” reveals: as late as 1947 the Amsterdam transit authority hired a debt collector because they never received payment from the Nazis for the deportation of Anne Frank. The news made shockwaves in the Dutch and international press, when the film premiered in The Netherlands, March 2024. ‘Lost City’ shows the untold story of the Amsterdam city tram that collaborated with the Nazis and deported tens of thousands of Jews, including Anne Frank. We experience their last tram ride. The film is a road movie with the original tram, passing the beautiful but guilty places where the drama unfolded. A survivor: “Everybody knew, everybody saw it, and nobody took action. People looked away”. ‘Lost City’ shows a new perspective on the murder of the Amsterdam Jews. The city lost its Jewish soul forever.
